

# The Roots of Faith—Old Testament

## *Exploring the Old Testament from Beginning to End*

**Course fee:** \$250, includes instructional materials, lunches, and snacks.

### **I. Instructional Materials**

### **II. Course Rationale**

To be most effective in evangelism and discipleship, believers need to possess a good working knowledge of God’s redemptive plan, as it unfolds chronologically through the Old and New Testaments. They need to be equipped to present the gospel of Jesus Christ with enough Bible content and Biblical context as is necessary for recipients to clearly understand the Bible’s message of redemption, in spite of the worldview noise that may tend to distort the Bible’s message. This course is designed to equip believers to tell God’s story of redemption, as it has been revealed in the Old Testament.

### III. Course Units

This course will be organized around 12 Old Testament eras. The 50 “events” (lessons) that comprise The Roots of Faith—Old Testament will fit into those 12 eras.

### IV. Course Goal and Objectives

By the end of this course, the student will demonstrate an understanding of God’s redemptive plan as it was revealed chronologically through the Old Testament *and* other very pertinent related historical and doctrinal Old Testament content by...

- A. Identifying important people, events, dates, geographic locations, and theological concepts contained in the Old Testament, especially those that are most significantly associated with God’s story of redemption.
- B. Arranging these Old Testament events and people in their proper chronological order.
- C. Communicating the core elements of the story of redemption in the proper chronological sequence.
- D. Presenting this story of redemption in a meaningful way to people who have had little or no contact with Biblical Christianity.
- E. Using key theological truths contained in God’s story of redemption to confront pagan worldview noise issues, as needed, to help unbelievers truly understand and sincerely embrace the true gospel of Jesus Christ and/or to help believers align their belief systems with the truths of God’s Word.

## V. Student Learning Activities

### All students will...

- A. Participate in Bible study activities throughout the course. The course will be intensely student-involved. Most of the class time will be dedicated to “hands on” Bible study.

### ABWE pre-field missionaries (to fulfill their Old Testament course requirement) must...

- B. Read a chronologically arranged edition of the Old Testament in a thoughtful, meaningful manner. ***The Daily Bible: NIV Version, With Devotional Insights to Guide You Through God’s Word*** (by F. LaGard Smith and published by Harvest House).

- C. Take one comprehensive exam (offered online) that covers the essential concepts taught in the course—key content, chronology, and geography.

At the beginning of the course, students will be given guidelines for how to prepare for the exam—the kinds of “need to know” content that they should master throughout the course.

He or she will have two chances to pass this exam. If a student fails the exam twice, another (customized) arrangement will be made for the completion of the Old Testament course requirement.

- D. Take two subsequent quizzes (offered online) that only cover the chronology of the Old Testament—12 eras and 50 events.
  1. No earlier than four weeks following the last day of TROF-OT course.
  2. No earlier than eight weeks following the last day of TROF-OT course.

## VI. Academic Credit Option (three credits)

Students taking this course for graduate level will be required to complete some additional requirements, as well as the “base” requirements mentioned above:

### Two options (Choose One):

#### A. Teaching Option

1. Teach or team-teach the TROF-OT course to a group of students.
2. Write a report (12-20 pages) regarding significant experiences encountered during that course.

#### B. Reading Option

1. Read *The Old Testament Story* workbook that is available through ABWE’s Center for Excellence in International Ministries. Contact: CEIM@abwe.org
2. Read *Genesis in Space and Time* by Francis Schaeffer (Downers Grove, IL: Intervarsity Press, 1972).
